



# Toward Net Zero Emission in Bangkok

## 10:30-12:00(UTC + 2), 9 November 2022

Bangkok has successfully reduced its 2020 GHG emissions by -24% compared with BAU scenario and strengthened its resilience infrastructure. Mr. Chadchart Sittipunt, New Bangkok Governor, has announced further strengthening of Bangkok's climate action with enhanced 2030 target and 2050 Net Zero Emission, as the capital city of Thailand and a leading Mega City of the Southeast Asian Region.
